**EMERGENCY ORDER 2022-01**

**WHEREAS**, on September 23, 2022, the Governor issued Executive Order No. 22-218 and declared that a state of emergency existed for several counties in Florida’s Peninsula and the Florida Keys due to Tropical Depression Nine; and

**WHEREAS**, on September 24, 2022, the Governor issued Executive Order No. 22-219, amending Executive Order No. 22-218 to declare that a state of emergency existed for the State of Florida; and

**WHEREAS**, as of 11:00 PM EDT on September 23, 2022, Tropical Depression Nine gathered into Tropical Storm Ian; and

**WHEREAS**, Tropical Storm Ian became a major hurricane before making landfall along Florida’s West Coast; and

**WHEREAS**, the Florida Division of Emergency Management, working together with the National Hurricane Center to evaluate weather predictions, has determined there is a continuing risk of dangerous storm surge, heavy rainfall, flash flooding, strong winds, hazardous seas, and isolated tornadic activity for Florida’s Peninsula and portions of the Florida Big Bend, North Florida, and Northeast Florida, which conditions are projected to constitute a major disaster; and

**WHEREAS**, the Governor issued Executive Order No. 22-218 on September 23, 2022, and Executive Order No. 22-219 on September 24, 2022, pursuant to the authority vested in him by Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Florida Constitution and by the State Emergency Management Act, as amended, and all other applicable laws, and declared a state of emergency in the State of Florida; and

**WHEREAS**, Executive Order No. 22-218 authorizes each state agency to suspend the provisions of any regulatory statute prescribing the procedures for conduct of state business or the orders or rules of that agency, if strict compliance with the provisions of such statute, order, or rule would in any way prevent, hinder or delay necessary action in coping with the emergency;

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, RUSSELL C. WEIGEL, III**, Commissioner, Office of Financial Regulation (“Office”), pursuant to the authority granted by Executive Order No. 22-218, and s. 252.46, Florida Statutes, as amended, find the timely execution of the mitigation, response, and recovery aspects of the State’s emergency management plan, as it relates to Hurricane Ian, is negatively impacted by the application of certain regulatory statutes and administrative rules related to the Office. Therefore, I order the following:

Section 1 - Division of Consumer Finance:

For the holder of any license issued by the Office under Chapters 494 and 560, Florida Statutes, which is either headquartered in or has locations in the State of Florida and has an annual financial condition report or financial statement filing deadline occurring in the month of September or October, 2022, the existing deadline is suspended and tolled until the expiration of Executive Order No. 22-218, or any extension thereof.

Section 2 - Division of Financial Institutions:

The deadlines under the Florida Financial Institutions Codes for all state trust companies and registered family trust companies to file the third quarter call or financial report, and all international branches and international bank agencies to file

the third quarter capital equivalency and asset maintenance report, are suspended and tolled until the expiration of Executive Order No. 22-218, or any extension thereof.

The deadline under the Florida Financial Institutions Codes for state banks, credit unions, and international branches and international bank agencies to file the September 30th consolidated reports of condition and income (“Call Reports”), originally due on October 30, 2022, is suspended and tolled until the expiration of Executive Order No. 22-218, or any extension thereof.

No late fee shall be assessed in connection with any deadline for action or reporting or filing that is extended or suspended and tolled during this period.
